The new owners eagerly began their research, seeking out small, privately owned, boutique resorts worldwide. They found that the best places worked in concert with what nature provided instead of inserting a cookie cutter pattern. The seamless atmosphere combined with sleep comfort and surprising extras made the model for the new Crow's Nest.

The communal areas needed to stay true to nature, allowing guests to explore the grounds without being assaulted by plastics. The Crow's Nest's natural pathways and wooden wrap-around decks were not ordered out of a construction catalog, they were built by the hands of craftsmen and fit seamlessly with the handcrafted log cabins. The upper viewing deck not only boasts an enormous outdoor hot tub and sauna, it overlooks the Alaska Range so guests are always connected with nature.
